

Students are expected to follow the expectations listed above each day. After receiving a verbal warning, if an individual student is still struggling to follow the expectations, they will receive a "Fix It Ticket". This form will be sent home and will explain what happened and will also express how the student hopes to handle the situation differently going forward.

In addition to the "Fix It Ticket", the individual student will lose time from Fun Friday Recess (explained below) for not following the expectations.

The "Fix It Ticket" requires a signature of a parent/guardian and needs to be returned to Mrs. Zito the following day.

"Fun Friday Recess" Incentive



Each week, the class starts with 10 minutes of extra recess on Friday. If the class as a whole has an awesome week and follows the expectations listed above, they will receive the full 10 minutes of Fun Friday Recess.

If the class is struggling to follow the expectations, a minute will be taken off Fun Friday Recess each time learning has to be stopped during the week due to the expectations not being followed.

Curriculum

English Language Arts (ELA)

Wit & Wisdom allows students to develop reading, writing, speaking, listening, vocabulary and language skills together at the same time. Rich and complex texts are used to build knowledge on important topics as students work towards mastering literacy skills. Students will write about their reading to demonstrate comprehension throughout the year. They will engage in narrative, informative/explanatory, and opinion writings to demonstrate their understanding.

<u>Math</u>

Eureka Math focuses on key concepts that are layered over time. The goal is for students to gain a complete body of math knowledge and not just a discrete set of skills. The same models and problem solving methods are used from grade to grade to provide consistency and deeper understanding throughout the years.

<u>Science</u>

The following topics will be covered:

- From Molecules to Organisms: life cycles of plants and animals
- Biological Evolution: animal/plant fossils, survival, and impact of environmental changes
- Heredity: traits inherited from parents and environmental influences
- Ecosystems: in particular habitats, some organisms survive well while others don't
- Motion and Stability: balanced & unbalanced forces, contact & non-contact forces, and motion
- Earth Systems: weather conditions, climate, and the impact of weather-related hazards

<u>Social Studies</u>

The following topics will be covered:

- Civics: communities, rules and laws, and democratic process
- Geography: landforms, regions and cultures, and global interconnections
- Economics: goods/services, trade, and banks/financial institutions
- History: how people and events have shaped communities over time
